

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MOTT CITY COUNCIL

June 13, 2011

The Council met at 7:30 pm for their regular scheduled meeting on June 13, 2011. Present were Mosbrucker, Steiner, Zich, Scheeler, Messmer, Wangsvick and Riedlinger. Also present for the meeting were Sheriff Warner, Darla Messmer, Paul and Sandy Helland, Shirley Halvorson, and Kerry Mosbrucker. All motions are carried, unless otherwise stated.

The meeting was called to order and Messmer moved to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Scheeler.

Sheriff Warner presented the police report. Discussion was held on curfew hours, council will check and see what area communities are doing. Riedlinger moved to accept the police report as given, seconded by Zich.

K. Mosbrucker gave the superintendent's report. Shirley Halvorson discussed their sewer line and was hoping that the city would fix the sewer main. The city is to be notified when Halvorson's start work on their line and will fix the city line at the same time. Messmer moved and Zich seconded to fix the alley on 2nd Street between Indiana and Wisconsin on the south side. Council also discussed mosquito spraying.

Darla Messmer was present to inquire about the trailer court behind city hall.

Paul Helland was present to discuss that little circle on Block 28 of Mott Original that the city owns. He has had his lot surveyed. The city will have the city attorney draw up a deed to him for his portion of the circle to make his lot line straight.

Ken Davis of Roosevelt Custer Regional Council was present to give a progress report on the 2009 Flood Buyout.

The meeting was turned over to Council President Kellen Messmer.

Troy Mosbrucker, representing "4 Corners Car Wash" has submitted an application for Tax Abatement. Steiner moved and Zich seconded approving the application. All voted in favor. A public hearing will be held before the next council meeting on July 11th to hear any public opinions.

The meeting was turned back to Mayor Mosbrucker.

Zich moved and Steiner seconded approval of the raffle and calendar raffle application submitted by the Catholic Altar Society.

Darrel Gobble has submitted a variance for his multi-dwelling house that will be ADA accessible. After a short recess to go up to his lot and measure, council returned and Zich moved to accept variance, seconded by Wangsvick. Riedlinger moved to accept this building permit #1674 that was changed to a multi-dwelling home and ADA accessible along with variance, seconded by Steiner.

Wangsvick moved to accept the following building permits, seconded by Zich: #1676 – Heidi Liebig – fence; #1677 James Jahner - Garden Shed; #1678 Dean & Kristin Wehri – deck; #1679 Corey Johnson – house; #1680 Gary Klein – fence; #1681 Crane Law Office – Interior Remodel; #1682 Dale Friedt – driveway and sidewalk; #1683 – 4 Corners Car Wash.

Corey Johnson has asked council to see if his curb stop for the new house he will be building can be moved and council said it can be moved closer to the lot line. He was also wondering about being able to burn the old current house that is on that property, which council did not approve.

Messmer moved and Scheeler seconded the ND Department of Health's yearly water contract.

Steiner moved and Riedlinger seconded the signing of the Office of the State Tax Commissioner biennial contract to administer the City's local sales, use and gross receipts taxes for the 2011-2013 biennium. Zich moved and Messmer seconded the appointment of Troy Mosbrucker to the County Re-Districting Board.

Zich moved and Scheeler seconded the bid received from John Price for Lot 26, Blk 28 of Mott Original with the stipulation that this lot cannot be sold separately from Lot 27, Blk 29 of Mott Original without notification to the city.

Bills were presented. Zich moved to pay the following bills, seconded by Steiner.
